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## **Professional Biography**

Robert R. Shane received his Ph.D. in Art History and Criticism from Stony Brook University where he studied with Dr. Donald Kuspit and completed coursework in philosophy with Kelly Oliver and Jacques Derrida. Dr. Shane's art criticism has appeared in *The Brooklyn Rail*, his scholarly research has been published in *Hypatia*, and he has written several exhibition essays. His current book project in process is *Mirroring Mothers: Witnessing Maternal Subjectivity in Contemporary Art*.

Dr. Shane was Associate Professor of Art History at the Center of Art & Design at College of Saint Rose in Albany, New York, until the Center's closure in 2021; former Managing Editor of the journal *Art Criticism* published by Stony Brook University; and a frequent contributor of essays and entries on art for books published by Phaidon Press, London.
